Dr Ho served voluntarily in various education organisations, including: Chairperson of the HKACMGM; former Honorary Professional Consultant, Department of Educational Administration and Policy, Faculty of Education, CUHK; Deputy Program Coordinator and Part-time Lecturer, Certificate Course in Career Education for Secondary School Teacher, Faculty of Education & Hong Kong Institute of Educational Research, CUHK; Council Member of Hong Kong Examination and Assessment Authority (HKEAA); Vice-chairperson of Research and Development Committee, HKEAA; Member of Appeal Review Committee, HKEAA; Member of HKDSE Risk Management Task Force, HKEAA; Member of Applied Learning Committee under Curriculum Development Council, Education Bureau (EDB), Hong Kong.

Dr Ho is an experienced school administrator, careers mistress, vice-principal of secondary school, tutor and trainer in professional development courses or programmes organised by EDB, HKACMGM and various tertiary institutes on career guidance, career education, general guidance, liberal studies and research methods. She was in charge of projects of HKACMGM on “Individual Student Planning” and “Preparing Students for Successful Transition in the New Academic Structure: Effective Presentation and Planning Ahead”. She also co-edited and co-authored career development tools with scholars, professionals and experienced careers teachers, namely, *Finding Your Colours of Life* for junior secondary students, *Career Mapping and Career Interest Inventory: On-line Version* for senior secondary students.
