

Hong Kong History (MULS0028)

Introduction

This lecture offers a concise survey of the history of Hong Kong. Emphasis will be placed on Hong Kong's connection with Mainland China and overseas Chinese communities, with the flows of people as well as those of business and trade forming the links in the process of networking. Equally important is the role of Hong Kong being a social and cultural node linking up with the global Chinese networks. The formation of Hong Kong society in the post-war decades and the constitution of a local identity since the 1970s are largely embedded in this broader and longer history of flows of people, economic activity, and cultural exchanges.
