Ms Violet SUNG obtained her Bachelor of Arts degree and Master of Philosophy (MPhil) in Cultural Studies from the Lingnan University; and Postgraduate Diploma in Education (Liberal Studies) from the Chinese University of Hong Kong; and Master of Education (Special Needs, Giftedness and Counselling) from the Education University of Hong Kong. She is a certified Global Career Development Facilitator (GCDF), a certified SENG (Supporting the Emotional Needs of the Gifted, USA) facilitator and a certified PEERS® School-Based Educator in Hong Kong.

Having been working in the education field for over 10 years, Ms SUNG has experience supporting gifted students and students with special educational needs. She was an advisory teacher in the careers and counselling team while teaching at secondary schools. She also organised and coordinated professional development programmes on moral and civic education for teachers while working as a project coordinator in the Education Bureau. She has been involved in programme design and delivery for gifted students in the humanities domain in the previous Student Programmes and Services Division of the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education (HKAGE). Currently, Ms Sung is a Guidance Counsellor in the Affective Education Division of the HKAGE. She delivers lectures, courses and provides counselling services for gifted students and their parents, as well as professional development seminars for teachers. Ms Sung has been invited to share her experience at different events held locally and overseas, with inviters including the World Congress on Special Needs Education in the UK, the Cross-Strait Forum on Special Education in Taiwan, the Learning and Teaching Expo in Hong Kong, and the Hong Kong Science and Technology Parks Corporation.

Ms Candy LAU obtained her Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Counselling and Psychology from the Shue Yan University; and Postgraduate Diploma in Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) from The Open University of Hong Kong. She is a certified trainer in conducting CBT-Context Based Social Competence Training as well as PEERS® Adolescents Providers in Hong Kong.

Ms Lau has been working in the education and NGO field for almost 10 years, she has solid experience in working with students with giftedness and special educational needs, especially students with ASD. She was a guidance officer in the Counselling Teams in prestigious schools. She has served more than 500 students and led 700 group sessions with about 1,000 hours in total on different topics such as emotional regulations, social skills, theory of minds and executive function. She is particularly skilful in designing groups, teaching resources and curriculum materials for psychological theories through the implication of visual aids and evidence-based practice. She is also very experienced in designing resource kits for students with ASD.

Ms Lau is one of the Project Officers in the Jockey Club 'Gifted in Bloom – Harmony in Heart & Mind' programme of HKAGE. With a view to refining and enhancing the quality of teaching and learning initiatives in nurturing the affective development of gifted students, she develops, coordinates and delivers new affective education programmes and a variety of professional services including courses, workshops, seminars and support for student learning.
