### **Ms SUNG Hung Mui Violet Guidance Counsellor Affective Education Division, HKAGE**

Ms Violet SUNG obtained her Bachelor of Arts degree and Master of Philosophy (MPhil) in Cultural Studies from the Lingnan University; and Postgraduate Diploma in Education (Liberal Studies) from the Chinese University of Hong Kong; and Master of Education (Special Needs, Giftedness and Counselling) from the Education University of Hong Kong. She is a certified Global Career Development Facilitator (GCDF), a certified SENG (Supporting the Emotional Needs of the Gifted, USA) facilitator and a certified PEERS® School-Based Educator in Hong Kong.

Having been working in the education field for over 10 years, Ms SUNG has experience supporting gifted students and students with special educational needs. She was an advisory teacher in the careers and counselling team while teaching at secondary schools. She also organised and coordinated professional development programmes on moral and civic education for teachers while working as a project coordinator in the Education Bureau. She has been involved in programme design and delivery for gifted students in the humanities domain in the previous Student Programmes and Services Division of the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education (HKAGE). Currently, Ms Sung is a Guidance Counsellor in the Affective Education Division of the HKAGE. She delivers lectures, courses and provides counselling services for gifted students and their parents, as well as professional development seminars for teachers.
