- : The Parent-Child Creative Workshop offers creative activities that parents can engage with their children and help nurture their creativity. During this workshop, parents can also understand the positive and negative influences of parent-child communication on their children's creativity development. It is expected that parents will be more supportive and appreciative toward their children's creativity upon completion of workshop.

Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

- Upon completion of the workshop, parents should be able to:
1. Demonstrate some creative thinking and ideas;
 2. Encourage their children's creativity through verbal and nonverbal appreciation;
 3. Analyse how their parent-child communication style promotes/impedes their children's creativity;
 4. Correctly describe and explain the factors in parent-child communication that promote or impede the development of their children's creativity;
 5. Facilitate children to exercise creativity in everyday life;
 6. Identify creative attributes of their children;
 7. Describe the importance of a positive environment for the development of their children's creativity;
 8. Apply the learnt knowledge and skills to facilitate their children's creativity in activity
 9. Indicate the merits and demerits of different parent-child communication styles for the development of children's creativity.
