Professional Supervisor for School - based Educational Psychology Services of the Lutheran Church - Hong Kong Synod

Helen Siu Yin KU-YU is currently the Professional Supervisor for School-based Educational Psychology Services of the Lutheran Church - Hong Kong Synod, after retirement from her long term commitment being Assistant Professor at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University. With dual professional training background as a trainer for students in social work and educational psychology, Helen is a Registered Educational Psychologist, Associate Fellow and ex-Chair of the Division of Educational Psychology of the Hong Kong Psychological Society. Helen has been active in advocacy and research on gifted education and talent development in local and global networks. As a life member and Hong Kong S.A.R. Delegate to the World Council for Gifted and Talented Children, Helen strives to advance world-wide knowledge and strategies on gifted education and she has served as a Secretary and Treasurer of the Asia-Pacific Federation on Giftedness. As a pioneer, Helen was commissioned by the then Hong Kong Government to complete two classified research projects on identifying the first cohort of Hong Kong gifted students in 1992-95 and norming the Torrance Tests of Creative Thinking. Over the past two decades, Helen has been appointed by the Education Bureau of the Government of the Hong Kong S.A.R. to respectively serve as a Committee Member of the Curriculum Development Council (Gifted Education Committee) and a Board member of the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education. As an advocate for effective parenting of the gifted and talented, Helen is a Founding Adviser for both the Hong Kong Gifted Family Association and the Hong Kong Association for Parents of Gifted Children.
