Dr Lam then obtained her fellowship in Anaesthesiology and worked as specialist Anaesthetist in several hospitals among different clusters.

After then, she obtained her fellowship in Pain Medicine in 2012. In the same year, Dr Lam started her private practice and provided Anaesthetic care for patients in the private hospital and clinic. Now she also takes part in several volunteer organisations, including HIS Foundation and Red Cross, to provide free Anesthetic services for patients in need.
