

Junior Journalist Scheme (HUMP1811)

Introduction

This course will be hosted by instructors with extensive news and media experience. It will probe into the roles journalists and media play in globalisation and how news media operates under this trend. Students are expected to develop abilities of information collection, consolidation and organisation, team spirit. They can also learn interview etiquette and skills, as well as cultivating leadership. In the last session of the course, participants will have a chance to produce a news feature by taking up different roles.

Intended Learning Outcomes



Upon completion of the programme, participants should be able to:

1. Understand the fundamental values of news in a globalised context,
2. Know some interview skills and produce a simple news feature,
3. Understand the importance of seeking proof before making judgement.

This programme is Programmes with No Screening

There are no screening questions, written test or other screening methods for this type of programmes.

- Student members can select up to 5 programmes from a list of selection. Applicants have to state the priority when submitting the application. (1st priority, 2nd priority, 3rd priority, etc). 1 token is required for each programme (For programme list, please refer to page 42 to page 43 of [Gifted Gateway](#) Issue No.13;
 - Application can only be submitted once. Once it is submitted, the priority and the programme selection cannot be changed;
 - If a student member removes a programme from the application before the application deadline by withdrawal, the choice priority will remain unchanged. (For example: A student has selected three programmes and removed the programme with the 1st priority from the application. The choices of 2nd and 3rd priority will remain unchanged with no promotion in priority.);
 - We will select the students based on the student's choice of priorities and a randomly generated selection by the computer system. If there is time clash between the applied programme and other programmes with offer, HKAGE will consider if the application will be accepted;
 - Priority will be given to student members who have not completed the applied programmes;
 - Student members should avoid applying programmes with time clash;
- The decision of HKAGE on the result of selection should be final.
