Introduction

We, humans are kind of social animals and social relationships pervade every aspect of human life. In fact, we are far more dependent on our social relationships than the other animals. Interacting with other people is inevitable and so do you think you know how to establish rapport, get along with, as well as managing conflicts with others? What skills do you need if you would like to have adaptive interaction and develop healthy relationship with people around you?

With 3 separated yet correlated monthly sessions held from May to July, you will be provided with an opportunity to learn more about social relationships, particularly getting along with your peers, family and teachers.

We are now going to have the 2nd session of this series of workshops (after learning about your social style and the basics of interaction skills in the 1st session), which you will uncover the power of empathy in establishing rapport, making and keeping social relationship with your peers.

Meanwhile, through experiential learning activities, you will not only understand how giftedness may influence friendship development, but also realise what kind of friends are right for you. Moreover, further to our discussion in Self-Management I, adaptive and maladaptive coping strategies for fitting in with peers (conformity) and peer pressure will be explored in depth.

 4. Develop adaptive coping strategies for fitting in with peers and peer pressure

Application Procedure



This programme is Programmes with No Screening

There are no screening questions, written test or other screening methods for this type of programmes.

- Student members can select up to 5 programmes from a list of selection. Applicants have to state the priority when submitting the application. (1st priority, 2nd priority, 3rd priority, etc). 1 token is required for each programme (For programme list, please refer to the issue 14 of Gifted Gateway ([click here](#)));
- Application can only be submitted once. Once it is submitted, the priority and the programme selection cannot be changed;
- If a student member removes a programme from the application before the application deadline by withdrawal, the choice priority will remain unchanged. (For example: A student has selected three programmes and removed the programme with the 1st priority from the application. The choices of 2nd and 3rd priority will remain unchanged with no promotion in priority.);
- We will select the students based on the student’s choice of priorities and a randomly generated selection by the computer system. If there is time clash between the applied programme and other programmes with offer, HKAGE will consider if the application will be accepted;
- Priority will be given to student members who have not completed the applied programmes;
- Student members should avoid applying programmes with time clash;
- The decision of HKAGE on the result of selection should be final.
