### **Concurrent Session A1 (9:25am – 11:25am)**

#### **Interactive Session: Room Escaped**

##### **Capacity: 20**

A group of participants are locked in a dim room. With the help of a torch, and more importantly your teammates, you need to solve a number of puzzles in the room within a time limit. Each puzzle will reveal a hint or a tool leading to the next puzzle. If puzzles are solved successfully, you will find the key to unlock the room and escape. Cooperation and communication will always lead you to the destination.

### **Concurrent Session B1 (9:25am – 10:25am)**

#### **Interactive Session: Life Monopoly**

##### **Capacity: 30**

The average person makes 35,000 decisions a day. They accumulate and affect our life experiences. In Life Monopoly, you will be assigned a random character of a contingent story based on Hong Kong history. Voting with your feet after discussion with other participants, you will decide the next step of the character, ranging from school to retirement, with jobs, marriage, and possible children along the way. The take-home messages include: one can never reverse a decision, life is full of uncertainty, and life planning is important for achieving life goals.

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## Concurrent Session B2 (10:25am – 11:25am)

### **Interactive Session: Introduction to Hong Kong Sign Language**

**Capacity: 30**

With the release of the anime movie “A Silent Voice” in 2016, sign language has become popular in the recent years. Nowadays, people are paying more and more attention to deaf groups and related affairs. In order to raise the interests of participants towards the sign language, fundamental vocabularies and sentence structure will be introduced. This course aims to teach participants the basics of Hong Kong Sign Language by teaching them words that are useful in daily conversation. Throughout the activity, they could gain insights of a new way of expressing themselves non-verbally through sign language.

## Concurrent Session A2 (11:25am – 12:25am)

### **Sharing Session: Gift & Grit**

**Capacity: 30**

A bright childhood does not guarantee a successful adulthood. Whether a gifted child becomes talented depends on his/her interpersonal communication and emotion management. These skills affect their thought, feelings, behaviour, habits, and even characters, which determines their encounters in life. In this sharing session, two speakers will share the challenges and opportunities faced in their development, as well as how their potential would lay the foundation of their success.

Amy So is a Form 4 student at Wong Shiu Chi Secondary School. She became a student member of humanity domain in primary six. Recently, Amy has participated in Assembly@MaD Festival 2019 and has started to cooperate with i-dArt institute. She will be sharing her experience and thoughts of visiting and cooperating with i-dArt institute, and also her passion of art and photography.

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**Mr. Tom TSE, HKAGE alumni**

The story of Tom Tse, Year 1 student majoring in Media and Communication at CityU, provides us with an excellent example of how age does not matter when it comes to doing something great in life. Since a very young age of 15, Tom has been exploring his passion and talent in event management and communications. He began his career in 2014 as the Master of Ceremony for the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education Events and contributed greatly to the success of the events. Since then, he has continued to polish his communication and event management skills by becoming the Program Host at RTHK and the speaker of TEDxCityUHongKong. With his TEDx talk given about education system in Hong Kong, he has published his first book “20 letters to the Secretary for Education”, which sustains his passion on improving the education system in Hong Kong. In addition, he was also acclaimed for several achievements including the Youth Arch Student Improvement Award, and the Hong Kong Outstanding Students Award from Youth Arch Foundation. His success story has proven that anyone can be extraordinary by pushing themselves out of their comfort zone.

**Concurrent Session B3 (11:25am – 12:25am)**

**Sharing Session: Sharing Session: Listen to the Bookworm**

**Capacity: 30**

We know gifted students love to explore their world of knowledge through reading. However, we also understand that it is not easy to find someone to share your latest findings or Einstein theories. In this session, you are given the chance to share your thoughts or views inspired by any book or film you have read and watched, and to expand your interests by listening to presentations by fellow student members. You may even talk to the speakers in person to further exchange your thoughts, and build relationships. How exciting is that!

No matter you are here to share your latest findings or Einstein theories, or you want a precious opportunity to speak in front of fellow student members, you are always welcome to sign up as a speaker of the session regardless of the cause.

Don't worry, you will not be screened in order to become a speaker. If you are interested, you are welcome to sign up as a speaker. Experience doesn't matter. Simply respond to our invitation to become a speaker when we approach you in the recruitment email.

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We recommend you make up your mind on which book/movie to present. However, you will still have time to decide if you haven't done so. Any book or movie works (except publications with violence, strong language, political, discrimination and sex). You will give an 8- to 10-minute presentation with simple slides on your publication and idea and take questions from student members in a Q&A session for 2 to 4 minutes. You can give your presentation at the language of your choice, but it is recommended to conduct the session in Cantonese with slides in English to provide optimal understanding to the student members.
