Social Relationship (III) : Managing Conflicts

Introduction

Living in a socialized society, we all need to know how to collaborate and communicate with other people. Do you think you can establish relationships with others, get along well with them, and handle interpersonal conflicts? What skills are needed for building effective interpersonal relationships?

A series of 3 interrelated workshops will be held from June to August, one in each month. In the workshops, you will be able to learn on various topics related to social relations, including social styles, communication skills, empathy, getting along with your peers, family and teachers, conflict management, etc.

We will be having the last session of this series of workshops, which comes to tackle issues about getting along with family members (parents & siblings) and teachers. In fact, family is the very first social context that we learn and practise ways to interact with others. Such experience helps us develop communication and social skills. And then we stretch to schools and other social settings... So your family might mirror very closely some of the situations in school.

As such, you are going to explore how your traits are associated with giftedness, which are manifested in the family and school. On the other hand, you will learn effective social skills to cope with the conflicts between parents, and teacher through discussion and sharing.

2. Analyse which conflicts have positive functions and which have negative effects
3. Acquire knowledge and effective skills for managing conflicts

Application Procedure



This programme is Programmes with No Screening

There are no screening questions, written test or other screening methods for this type of programmes.

- Student members can select up to 5 programmes from a list of selection. Applicants have to state the priority when submitting the application. (1st priority, 2nd priority, 3rd priority, etc). 1 token is required for each programme (For programme list, please refer to the issue 18 of Gifted Gateway ([click here](#)));
- Application can only be submitted once. Once it is submitted, the priority and the programme selection cannot be changed;
- If a student member removes a programme from the application before the application deadline by withdrawal, the choice priority will remain unchanged. (For example: A student has selected three programmes and removed the programme with the 1st priority from the application. The choices of 2nd and 3rd priority will remain unchanged with no promotion in priority.);
- We will select the students based on the student’s choice of priorities and a randomly generated selection by the computer system. If there is time clash between the applied programme and other programmes with offer, HKAGE will consider if the application will be accepted;
- Priority will be given to student members who have not completed the applied programmes;
- Student members should avoid applying programmes with time clash;
- The decision of HKAGE on the result of selection should be final.
