








# Journey To Mars 2025 (E3AST001C)

<b>Introduction</b>	<p>The rise of private space enterprise and new rocket development have made the human mission to Mars closer to reality than ever. This course provides a guide to designing a manned mission to Mars using laws of physics and mathematics. Students can also experience space exploration through experiencing digital planetarium and observed Mars with telescopes if weather permits.</p>
