Introduction For the understanding of the subject 'religious studies', many people will associate it with 'theology'. In fact, 'religious studies' considers religion as an integral part of human life, thought and activity, including the relationship and context behind. It also focuses on cultivating the spirit of caring for society and understanding the characteristics of various cultures with a critical perspective. The speaker will also share his studying and working experiences in the Mainland, Taiwan and Hong Kong.

The speaker, Mr Chan Kai Yin, is a PhD candidate in history at Shanghai University. He obtained his undergraduate degree at Hong Kong Baptist University and his master's degree at Graduate School of Religion, Chung Yuan Christian University (CYCU). He published 'A Research and Rediscover on Stone Inscriptions of Daqin Jingjiao' in 2015.
