



Shall We TED Talk? (E2CAV001C)

Introduction	<p>Taught by a multiple-time TEDx speaker, this programme aims to train up students for giving (and receiving) confident and empathetic public speeches following the TED/TEDx tradition. Through a series of lectures and small-group coaching sessions, students will learn how to articulate opinions and passions, communicate authentically and powerfully, express emotions, and ultimately share ideas worth spreading.</p> <p>Students will also understand how to improve their delivery skills interactively with an inclusive and constructive peer feedback mechanism during the small-group coaching sessions. Towards the end of the training, students will run and moderate their own TED-inspired speech event.</p>
