For all the world's nations can gather together, discuss common problems, and find shared solutions that benefit all of humanity.</p> <p>Model United Nations (MUN) is an academic simulation in which students will represent a country as delegates and will have the opportunity to learn, debate and study global issues.</p> <p>This intense training programme aims to give students the relevant background and skills to join conferences under the Model United Nations (MUN) framework. It is designed for total newcomers to MUN without any prior experience and will cover both the theoretical foundation and relevant knowledge of international issues and political geography, as well as practical and transferable skills such as English public speaking, presentation and debating skills. Students may have the opportunity to join Model United Nations Conferences in HK or other regions.</p>
