<p><b>Introduction</b></p>	<p>Climate change is currently one of the most concerned topics in the world, and the Chief Executive also stated in the "2020 Policy Address" that the government will strive to achieve carbon neutrality in Hong Kong by 2050. Until now, various environmental protection policies have been formulated. However, the successful implementation of these policies depends greatly on effective environmental education, in which the environmental educators are playing a crucial role.</p> <p>Dr Ma is one of the few local environmental education and ecology researchers, with his research focuses on terrestrial forest ecology and the utilisation of outdoor education for school environmental education. Dr Ma has been involved in the field of environmental education for many years, assuming various roles including part-time lecturer for tertiary institutes, to coordinate, design and lead different kinds of environmental education programmes with targets ranging from members of the public such as pre-school kids, students, corporate employees, elders, etc., to teachers and environmental education practitioners. With his vast knowledge and experience, and significant effort in promoting the development of environmental education in Hong Kong, Dr Ma has received a number of awards and recognition.</p> <p>Dr Ma is also serving as member in several government advisory committees, including the Advisory Council on the Environment, the Endangered Species Advisory Committee and the Education Working Group of the Environmental Campaign Committee.</p>
