Course Description	: This workshop focuses on practical strategies to design a differentiated curriculum unit to meet the learning needs of gifted/high-ability students. An innovative aspect of this workshop is that participants will see a demonstrated lesson (with students) on how to effectively implement the differentiation strategies.

Effective curricular and instructional strategies/pedagogies to differentiate the learning [illustrate with lesson demonstration in Language Arts/ Social Studies] 3. Sharing effective practices of implementation and evaluation of differentiation in school 4. Application of strategies learned to develop a differentiated lesson (i.e. design 2 or more lessons on a topic)

5. * **Video Conferencing** with the speaker, a follow-up learning activity for the participants. Comments and suggestions to improve the unit design will be provided.

Brief Introduction to Speaker:



Dr Sandra Kaplan is a clinical associate professor for learning and instruction at the University of Southern California's Rossier School of Education. She has served as the lead consultant for the Carnegie Middle Schools Project, Texas Education Agency, from 1993 to present. She has authored and co-authored many books and articles on the nature and scope of differentiated curriculum for gifted learners.

Dr Kaplan is a past president of the National Association for Gifted Children (NAGC), of which she has been a member of since 1982. She is also a past president of the California Association for the Gifted. One of the world's foremost authorities in the field of gifted education, she has made presentations at various major international gifted education conferences. She has received various awards and honours. Recent honours include the Award of Achievement from the California Association for the Gifted and the Distinguished Service Award from NAGC. Dr Kaplan has published various academic journals, reports and books covering curriculum planning for the gifted students. She is familiar with the education systems and cultures of some Asian countries as she has delivered professional development programmes on gifted education for teachers in Asia.
