Course Description : Critical thinking is used to differentiate process within content areas and also as a valuable subject area in and of itself. The use of a model for critical thinking and for question asking is a powerful tool for repeated use to enhance learning over time. This workshop will help participants explore the use of the Paul's Elements of Reasoning model to facilitate a real world application of students' daily learning.

Course Objectives : Upon completion of this workshop, participants should be able to:

- Understand the importance of developing critical thinking in meeting the needs of gifted learners
- Acquire the essential knowledge and skills in using appropriate strategies (e.g. Richard Paul's *Elements of Reasoning*) to enhance students' critical thinking skills
- Recognise some implementation practices and resources available

Introduction of the speaker:

Dr. Kimberley Chandler is the Curriculum Director at the Center for Gifted Education at The College of William and Mary and Clinical Assistant Professor. Her background includes teaching gifted students in a variety of settings, serving as an administrator of a gifted programme, and providing professional development training nationally and internationally.

Kimberley serves on the National Association for Gifted Children Board of Directors, is Newsletter Editor for the Council for Exceptional Children's Talented and Gifted Special Interest Division (CEC-TAG), and is a USA Representative to the World Council for Gifted and Talented Children.

Kimberley co-authored a book titled *Effective Curriculum for Underserved Gifted Students*. She has also served as the editor of many curriculum materials from the Center for Gifted Education at William and Mary. She is currently co-authoring a book that will be published in 2013 about designing appropriate professional development experiences for practitioners in gifted education. Her research interests include curriculum policy and implementation issues in gifted programmes, the role of administrators in gifted programme development, and the design and evaluation of professional development programmes for teachers of the gifted.

In the past few years, Dr. Chandler had been invited by The Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education and the Education Bureau to deliver professional development training for school leaders and teachers. These professional development programmes were well received by the participants.
