

Important Notice

1. Only students of the age of 10-18 by the time of admission in June 2021 are eligible for applying for the HKAGE “Online Screening Programme”. If students are under the age of 10 by the time of admission in June 2021, their HKAGE membership will only be activated in the following month after they have reached the age of 10.
2. There is no limit on the number of student applicants from each school. However, each student can only apply for the “Online Screening Programme” once either via school or self nomination during the primary school study and twice during the secondary school study. For each nomination, each student can apply for ONE “Online Screening Programme” only with maximum two attempts on the final programme assessment.
3. As students who have successfully passed all screenings will become HKAGE student members only by the end of the school year in June where Secondary 6 (or equivalent to the last year in secondary school) students will be graduating from secondary schools. Therefore, applications for the HKAGE “Online Screening programme” from these students will not be accepted.
4. All applications must be completed between **7 September 2020 (9:00 a.m.) to 30 October 2020 (12:00 noon)** via the “School Account”. No changes or withdrawal can be made after the application deadline.
5. It is the applicant's responsibility to provide an **accurate and valid email address** for correspondence. If you do not receive the application confirmation email after submitting the application form, please contact Student Services Team by email (ss@hkage.org.hk) **within 3 working days**.
6. Students who have applied for the “Online Screening Programme” via “School Nomination” cannot apply for another “Online Screening Programme” via “Self Nomination”. The HKAGE will only consider the “School Nomination”.
7. Schools are encouraged to nominate junior students, who stand to gain the most from early identification and active participation in the HKAGE programmes. 8. Schools can also collect more student information through different channels (e.g. academic results, competition results and other recommendations) via the Education Bureau's Talent Databank module in the WebSAMS to help identify suitable students.
