

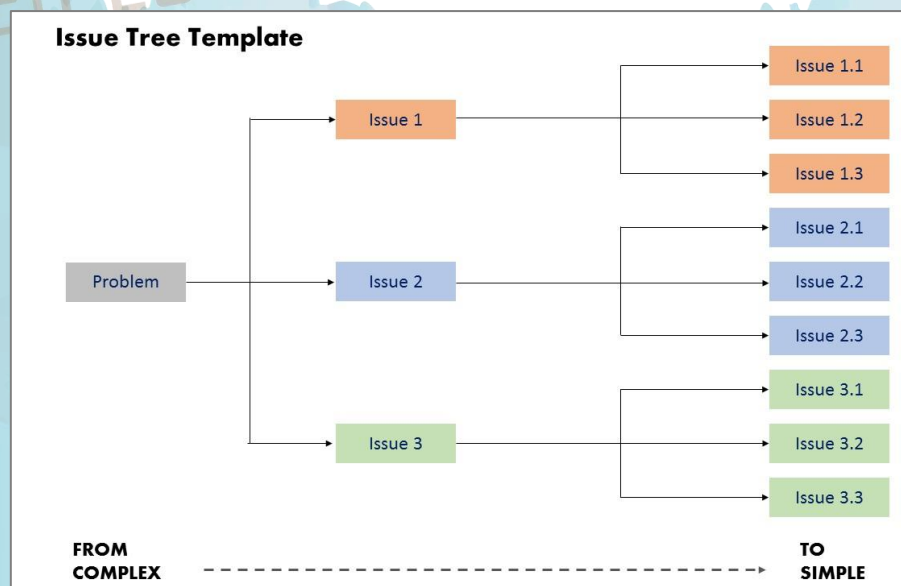
BIG IDEAS: Using Issue Trees to Unpack A Complex Problem

Introduction
