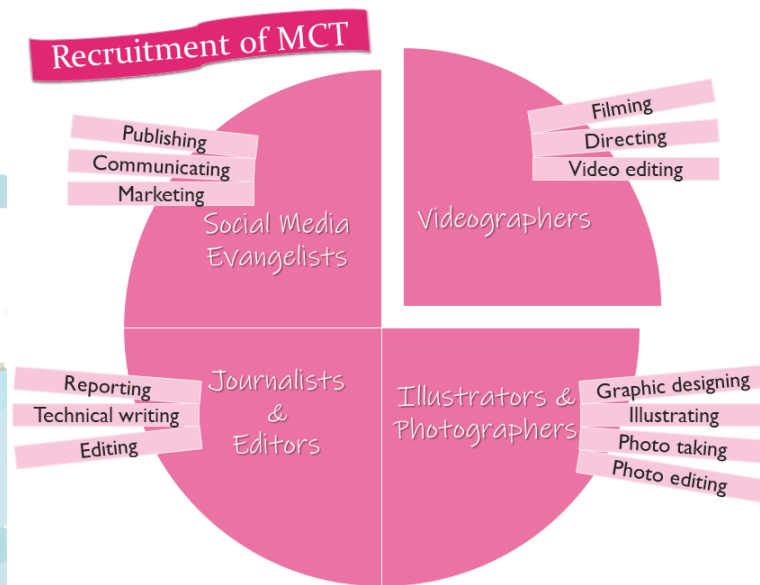


Recruitment of Student Media & Communication Team (MCT) Members

Introduction

- ❖ Attainment of intended learning outcomes
- ❖ Commitment and accomplishments demonstrated

Intended Learning Outcomes

Having completed the service-learning experiences, students should be able to

- develop and apply specialised skills into their creative work or services;
- design and plan the assigned tasks with thoughtful considerations of logistics, objectives, outcomes, stakeholders, resources, effectiveness and contingency measures;
- describe the possible challenges and obstacles before each task/ in related work field;
- initiate, design and create creative works that are ready for publication; and
- evaluate effectively and critically for continuous enhancement.
