De-colonialising Hong Kong: Field Study and Digitalising Local History (and Arguments in Safeguarding Local History and Culture) (MULS3630)

<p>Introduction</p>	<p>A whole new academic programme sponsored by the Jockey Club “Gifted in Bloom – Harmony in Heart & Mind” Programme shifting the focuses from “cognitive (knowledge)” to “affective (sensitivity, reflection, understanding, appreciation, expression, self-exploring, moral values, etc.)” aspect is now open for application! We hope that you will become knowledgeable as well as sensible, to feel other people’s feeling, to sense other people’s emotion, and step into others’ shoes, becoming a person with “empathetic understanding” skills! Moreover, we hope you can locate yourself in the fantastic world and project your visions to a greater future!</p> <p>When the “Hong Kong’s 1997 Handover” discussion launched between the Chinese and the British government in the mid-1980s, many Hong Kong people have chosen to migrate to other countries else than the Communist Party’s governance. “De-colonisation” has become the most popular issue in Hong Kong and buildings with “Colonial Style” were demolished. However, years past and many migrants returned to Hong Kong from overseas. Apart from the field trips, you will be able to make use of Geographic Information System and discover the complex relationship among Hong Kong history, building (and conservation), colonialisation (and de-colonialisation).</p>
